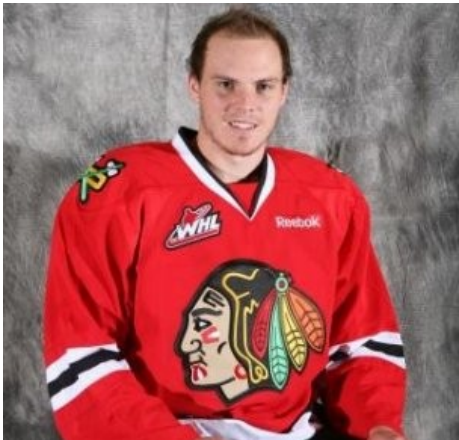

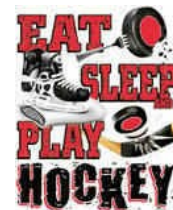

V r o o m a n ' s V o i c e

Hello again to the Booster Club! Amazing how quickly the season has gone by! As I'm writing this, I'm in the press box preparing for the Burgerville Daylight Classic game between the Hawks and the Prince George Cougars. Hard to believe that after this afternoon, the Hawks will only have 13 games left in the regular season! So as we reach the final homestretch of the campaign, I thought this would be a good time to look at some of the accomplishments that this current crop of Winterhawks are closing in on:

- Mac Carruth has already broken the franchise record for most wins in a season, a record previously held by 1998 Memorial Cup winner Brent Belecki. With 13 games left in the season, and 36 wins already under his belt, Carruth has a very good opportunity to become the first goaltender in franchise history to eclipse 40 wins. Carruth also now has 81 career wins, second in franchise history to Darrell May Sr.'s 105. Carruth obviously couldn't reach that record this year, but he does have a very good chance should he return for an overage season.
- Sven Bartschi currently has 78 points in 39 games, for an average of 2 points per game. The last player in the WHL's top 20 in season scoring (Bartschi is currently 10th in the league) to average 2 or more points per game was Byron Ritchie of the Lethbridge Hurricanes, who finished second in league scoring that year to the all-time leading scorer in Hawk history: Todd Robinson. The last time a Winterhawk averaged 2 points per game for an entire season was all the way back in 1993-94, when Lonny Bohonos had 152 Points in 70 Games Played.
- Ty Rattie currently sits on 97 points, and is 4 points back of Mark Stone for first overall in the WHL Scoring Race. If Rattie were to overtake Stone over the final few weeks of the WHL Regular season, he would become the first Winterhawk since Todd Robinson in 1996-97 to lead the WHL in points. Robinson had 134 points that year to pace the league. Rattie is also only 2 goals away from 50, and would become the first Hawk since Joe Balej in 2001-02 to score 50 in one season. In the Hawks' 11-2 victory over Seattle on Sunday, Rattie had his third career 5-point game, and second this season. He's the first Hawk with 2 5-point games since Marian Hossa had 2 in the 1997-98 season, and first Hawk with 3 or more career 5-point games since Lonny Bohonos, who had 3 overlapping over the 1992-93 and 1993-94 seasons. If Rattie were to pick up a third 5-point game over the final 13 games this year, he'd be the first Hawk with 3 5-point games in a season since Steve Konowalchuk in 1990-91.

It's been one heck of a year individually for the Hawks this season, and it's no surprise that the team is in the thick of the U.S. division title race once again, currently tied on points with the Tri-City Americans. If the Hawks prevail and win the title, it would be the first time since 1996-97 and 1997-98 that the team has won back-to-back division titles. The Hawks have certainly had an amazing season so far, and with the playoffs looming, I know the team is looking to win at least 3 more games than they did last year, and head off to Quebec as the WHL Champion and representative at the Memorial Cup. I'll talk to you as the playoffs begin.

Starting the month of February with the Everett game and having an opportunity to induct Brent Peterson into the Winterhawks Hall of Fame was special for everyone. While I was working in the NHL I had an opportunity to talk to Brent on a casual basis but never really got to know him well. Three days after Bill Gallacher purchased the team I received a call from Brent and since that time he has kept in regular contact and helped us on numerous occasions with recruits. As everyone describes Brent – he is a “quality person” who has impacted our organization as both a player and coach. Now he provides inspiration to thousands who face Parkinson’s after his recent successful surgery.

One thing that was evident as we moved through the month of February was that our team now had much more depth than earlier in the year. Reid and Noebels were now feeling more comfortable with our team and their roles. Gabriel started to play his best hockey since returning from the AHL before Christmas and Bartschi finally recovered from his tournament concussion. Now we have a scoring threat through 4 lines and can mix and match various combinations. Recently this has made it hard for opposition to match and decide who they want their checking group against.

For the first time since mid October we have closed the gap with Tri Cities and finally got back into the top 10 national rankings. Beating Tri 3 times this month along with their recent .500 play has created an interesting race for the division title. Spokane is not out of the picture as they continue to be one of the most consistent teams in our conference – rarely losing 2 games in a row.

In addition to team records as we enter the last 14 games there are a few individual accomplishments at stake. Mac Carruth will set the single season record for wins, Ross recorded his 100th goal, and Rattie should get 50 goals and 100 points which is incredible for an 18 year old. It is always amazing after the last regular season game in March as the coaching staff takes time to honor individual players for special moments during the year – how many players achieve career highs. I expect this year to be no different and look forward to seeing the records they set.

In addition to the busy schedule we have been busy off the ice signing several key players for the future. We have now signed forwards Adam DeChamplain (Alberta Jr A), Preston Kopeck (Alberta Jr A), Alex Schoenborn (US Midget), Steven Alldridge (BC Midget), Tyler Sandhu (BC Midget) and Dominic Turgeon (US Midget). The only new addition on the defense was Zac Paterson. All of these players are expected to have a good chance of making the team next year. You might be wondering how we can have so many new players but we expect 2012-13 to be a transition year and begin to build around the 1994-1996 age groups. I am hoping to have one or two more announcements in March so that we can solidify our team for the next three years.

Finally, although it was disappointing to lose Gary Davidson to Everett where he was announced as their new GM on Feb 17th – it was a great opportunity for him. Gary has been a coach, GM and owner at the

starting at the beginning of next season to develop new ideas for the pin. I believe having a pin adds to the overall professionalism of the Booster Club as well as it being a conversation piece.

As we get ready for playoffs and the close of the 2011-12 season, the Booster Club will once again be hard at work, looking to gain new items to generate income, create memorable fan trips to away games and develop an atmosphere at all home games that brings all fans together for the enjoyment of the game.

The Nominations and Elections of the Board and Council are here. We will sadly say goodbye to two offices of the Board who have found scheduling conflicts preventing them from continuing on past this year. Both Andy Potter as Vice President and Debi Koberstein as Treasurer, came on at the same time I did and it was like the 3 Musketeers. We relied on each other to begin the plan of new direction for the Club and in doing so, new challenges. Their hard work and dedication to the cause has helped us grow to where we are today and they will be missed. Thank you.

With that, a new chapter will begin of having a new Vice President, a new Treasurer and at least one new member on Council.

I can only hope 2012-13 is ready for us, because we will be ready for it!

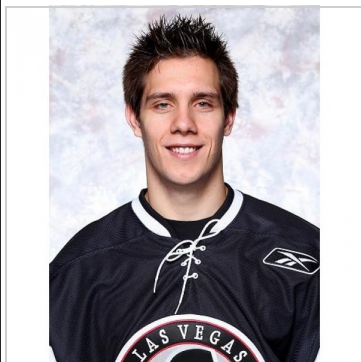

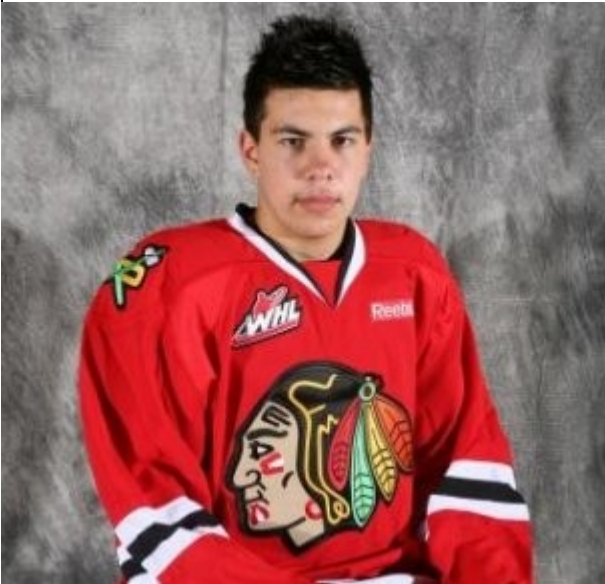

The math: This 16-year-old defenseman (he'll be 17 in August) hails from Edmonton, Alberta, but he spent much of his youth in Austria, where his father, defenseman Emanuel Viveiros, played and now coaches in the KAC. Layne was Portland's ninth round pick, 196th overall, in the 2011 WHL Bantam Draft. He played last season in Austria, where he had three goals and four assists for seven points in 11 games with Klagenfurter AC in the Austrian Under-20 league. His father played for the Prince Albert Raiders from 1982-1986, then played 29 games for the Minnesota North Stars from 1985-1988 before embarking on a lengthy career in Europe.*

Coach.

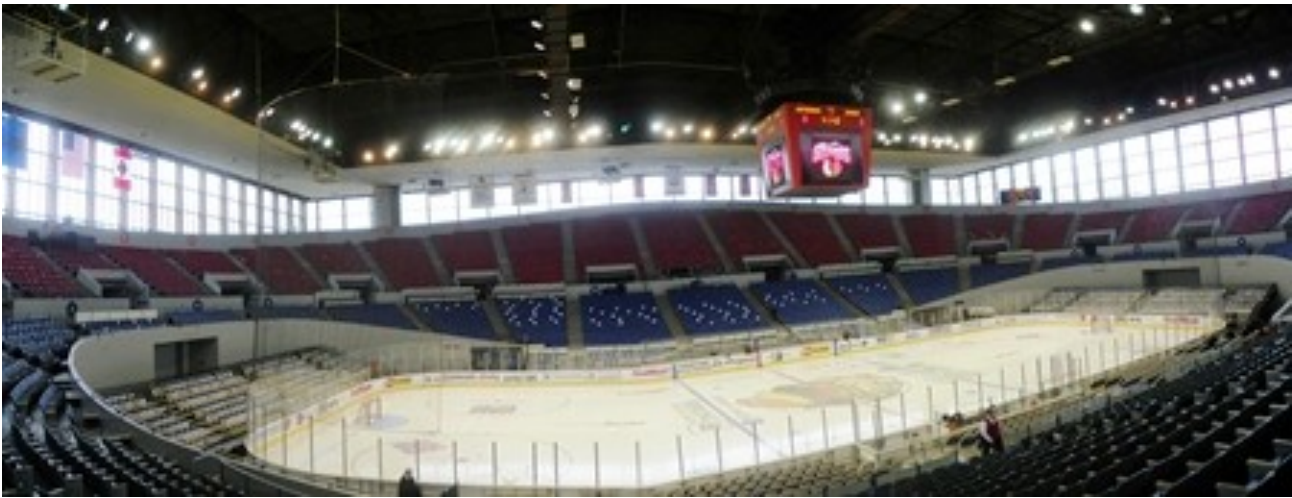
Who was your favorite player growing up?

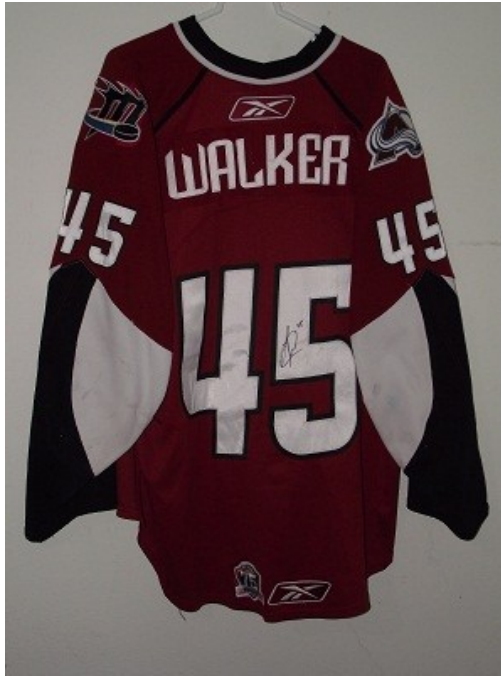
